SUMMARY:

At the conclusion of each quarter, staff prepares a summary of Community Services Programs and a staff level critique of the City's quarterly offerings to keep the Commission apprised of the accomplishments and out comings of the Department. As of November 30, 2016, a total of 1,146 participants were enrolled in programs for the fall 2016 quarter. Additional registration for classes and events will be accepted prior to the conclusion of the fall quarter. Revenue for the fall quarter at this time is \$78,342.

BACKGROUND:

The Community Services Department hosted its annual Halloween events on Saturday, October 29, 2016. "A Ghostly Affair" for ages 6 and under ran from 5:30-7:00pm, and "A'maze'ingly Haunted Hills" for ages 7 and older took place from 8:30-10:00pm. For this year's events, staff focused on promoting the events through the Community Services Department's Facebook page. The additional posts regarding the events resulted in a significant increase in participation for 2016. Table 1 below provides an event attendance comparison from 2014 through 2016.

A number of other programs were successful during the fall quarter, including the staff led “Hiking Club” program that filled to capacity with thirteen participants. “Playtime”, a pre-school program for children between the ages of 3-5 years, also filled to capacity during the fall quarter with 28 participants.

The Community Services Department is looking forward to its next special event, “Breakfast with Santa”. This event will take place Saturday, December 10th and will once again include photos with Santa, holiday crafts, and a delicious pancake breakfast.

SUMMARY:

The park quality control program was re-introduced to the Parks and Recreation Commission in October of 2015. As a suggested Community Services Department practice, staff is presenting to the Parks and Recreation Commission an annual summary of the Commission's park checks. A total of twenty two park checks were completed during calendar year 2016.
