4.1 2013 MEMORIAL DAY RACE: EVENT UPDATE

Community Services Superintendent Meehan provided an oral presentation to the Commission. Mr. Meehan indicated there was approximately 3,400 runners that participating in this year's event, up from 2,760 at last year's event. Superintendent Meehan indicated that out of the 3,400 participants, 320 were residents of Laguna Hills.

4.2 2013 4TH OF JULY CELEBRATION: EVENT UPDATE

Community Services Superintendent Meehan provided an oral presentation to the Commission on the event. Mr. Meehan indicated City Council had approved the Agreement with Pyro Spectaculars with the show originally presented to the Commission in addition to the new firing location.

Mr. Meehan indicated twelve (12) Non-profit groups will be participating at this year's event in addition to two (2) carnival rides, three (3) bounce houses, face painting, and various crafts that can be enjoyed by the community.

4.3 2013 EARTH DAY LAGUNA HILLS, ARBOR DAY AND DOCUMENT SHREDDING POST EVENT REPORT

Community Services Superintendent Meehan summarized the report. Mr. Meehan indicated sixty-three (63) people participated in the tree planting, trail clean-up, and *Green Expo*. Mr. Meehan stated that a new addition had been added to this year's event which was the free document shredding. Superintendent Meehan stated this portion of the event yielded approximately 248 cars producing roughly 12,000 pounds of paper which was recycled and kept out of the landfills.

ISSUE: 2013 MEMORIAL DAY HALF MARATHON, 10K AND 5K POST EVENT REPORT

SUMMARY:

The 15th annual City of Laguna Hills Memorial Day Half Marathon, 10K and 5K, honoring the USMC Dark Horse Battalion took place on Monday, May 27, 2013. Three thousand, four hundred runners (3,400) participated in the event. A number of the 3/5 Battalion Marines ran in the half marathon again this year, which along with the 5K and 10K, was led from the start line by a USMC Humvee and Grand Marshall Cpl. Josue Barron. A highlight of the community expo for 2013 was the presence of the Marines from the 3/5 Battalion along with a number of static displays. Total 2013 event expenditures, including staff time were \$172,866 and event revenues totaled \$177,229.

BACKGROUND:

The 15th annual City of Laguna Hills Memorial Day Half Marathon, 10K and 5K took place on Monday, May 27, 2013. Three thousand, four hundred (3,400) participants registered for the 2013 event, with sixty-seven percent (67%) utilizing the internet to pre-register. Approximately three hundred and sixty-five (365) registrations were accepted in person during the pre-registration and packet pick-up that took place at Road Runner Sports on Saturday, May 25 and Sunday, May 26 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Another two hundred and sixty-eight (268) runners registered in person on the morning of the event.

The City of Laguna Hills and South County Outreach again partnered in a food drive over the Memorial Day Weekend. Race participants and spectators were encouraged to bring canned goods and non-perishable food items to benefit South County Outreach. Collection stations were available at the race start line, in the community expo, and at Road Runner Sports during registration and pre-race packet pick-up. One hundred-forty pounds of food were collected. In addition, the proceeds from the sales of beer garden tickets, a total of \$2,530, were donated to South County Outreach.

As the Parks and Recreation Commission will recall the City Council selected the option of a pledge formula based on the Memorial Day Race registration revenues for the purpose of providing future financial assistance to the 3/5 Marine Support Committee. The pledge formula approved by the City Council was \$3.00 per paid 5K, 10K, and half marathon race participant. Applying this pledge formula to the total of 3,152 paid race

participants, the available community assistance funding for the 3/5 Marine Support Committee is \$9,456. A draft resolution for the City Council's consideration and approval to authorize community assistance funding in the amount of \$9,456 for the 3/5 Marine Support Committee will be presented to the City Council at its August 27, 2013, meeting.

Attached to the staff report is a one page event summary page provided to staff by the race timing company, Time Management. The summary page shows event totals per race, registration by city and state, along with registration taken on line, by mail, or in person.

A highlight of the community expo for 2013 was the presence of the Marines from the 3/5 Battalion. At the request of the 3/5 Support Committee, a number of static displays were brought to the event. The public was able to sit in the vehicles and interact with the Marines. In addition, for the first time since the City assumed responsibility for the event, a Grand Marshall was selected to start the race and participate in a ceremony at the finish line. Grand Marshall Cpl. Josue Barron, a wounded warrior that had served with the 3/5 Marine Battalion in Afghanistan, started the races from the back of a USMC Humvee. The Color Guard from the 3/5 Battalion was also on hand to present the nation's colors prior to the start of the races.

At its August 27, 2013, meeting, staff will be proposing to the City Council another two year contract with Renegade Racing for event management services for the 2014 and 2015 events be executed.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The 2013 Memorial Day Race event budget for direct expenditures was \$145,000 with a budget forecast for event sponsorships and registration revenue totaling \$150,500. Provided in Table 1 are the actual direct expenses of the event at \$149,649 with the actual revenue at \$177,229. Direct expenses were under event revenue by \$27,580. Including staff costs, the total expenses for the event were \$172,866.

ISSUE: 2013 FOURTH OF JULY POST EVENT REPORT

SUMMARY:

The City of Laguna Hills held the annual Fourth of July celebration at the Laguna Hills Sports Complex on Thursday, July 4, 2013. The special event took place between the hours of 4:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. and included a number of activities in addition to the fireworks show. A firework shell malfunction in this year's show caused the Fire Marshall to terminate the show less than five minutes after it had started. Expenditures for the 2013 Fourth of July Celebration totaled \$24,535, which accounts for the full refund of the fireworks deposit. Net costs for the event totaled \$18,809, when factoring in \$4,426 in ticket sales revenue and \$1,300 in vendor booth rentals revenue.

BACKGROUND:

Staff is estimating that more than 11,000 people attended the City of Laguna Hills' annual Fourth of July event this year. The 2013 Fourth of July event once again included carnival rides, games, informational and food booths, and entertainment. Total ticket sales revenue was \$4,426 for the two carnival rides. The Laguna Hills non-profit groups that sold food and other items informed staff that they were very pleased with their total profits. The non-profit vendors that participated in this year's event were:

- Boy Scout Troop 1602: Pizza and B-B-Q Corn
- LHHS Music Boosters: Nachos, Churros, and Candy
- Armenian Festival: Kebabs and Sandwiches
- Festival Singers: Hot Dogs
- LHHS Culinary Arts: Herb Spread, Bagel Bites, Chips, Jalapeno Spread
- LHHS Football Boosters: Drinks
- AYSO Region 1422: Chili and Cornbread
- LHHS Basketball: Hamburgers
- LHHS Water Polo Boosters: Shaved Ice
- LHHS Lacrosse Boosters: Iced Coffee and Cupcakes
- LHHS PTSA: Dippin' Dots
- LHHS Mandarin Club: Boba and Chinese Candy

As the Commission is aware, the event concludes each year with a musically choreographed fireworks show. Unfortunately this year two or three of the mortars misfired at ground level due to a manufacturing defect according to the Fire Marshall. This occurred just under five minutes into the show, and as a result the show was cut

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short. The planned duration of the fireworks show was 18:33 with a total of 1,100 shells. Per the agreement with Bay Fireworks the City received a full refund of the \$12,250 deposit that was paid and the City Council withheld the final payment of \$12,250 at its last meeting. The original cost of the show, per the agreement, was \$24,500.

A highlight of the 2013 event was the presence of Marines of the 3/5 Battalion. At the request of the 3/5 Support Committee several Marines attended the event, bringing with them static displays including vehicles, weapons and other equipment.

As the Parks and Recreation Commission will recall, the firing location for the fireworks display was moved away from the high school buildings at the direction of OCFA. On Friday, July 5, 2013, City staff walked the campus and found that no shells or debris had fallen on the track or football field, and that the pool area was free from any debris as well. A total of 10 Community Services staff members were on the Laguna Hills High School campus on Thursday July 5, clearing firework debris from the upper field and tennis courts. In addition, City staff arranged with Sunset Property Services to provide a street sweeper and staff to assist in the clean-up of the campus.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The adopted budget for FY 2013-2014 includes \$53,750 for the City's 2013 Fourth of July Celebration event. Expenditures for the 2013 Fourth of July Celebration totaled \$24,535 which does not include the total cost of the fireworks show. Net costs for the event totaled \$18,809, which accounts for \$4,426 in ticket sales revenue and \$1,300 in vendor booth rentals revenue. A nominal expense may be added to the overall total for SVUSD clean-up efforts of firework debris in areas that City staff could not access (e.g. roof areas). This expense is not currently represented in the figures presented in this staff report.

ISSUE: 2013 SPRING QUARTER EVALUATION

SUMMARY:

At the conclusion of each quarter, staff prepares a summary of Community Services Programs and a staff level critique of the City's quarterly offerings to keep the Commission apprised of the accomplishments and out comings of the Department. A total of 1,317 participants were enrolled in programs for the spring 2013 quarter. Revenue for the winter quarter totaled \$61,443.

BACKGROUND:

The Community Services Department hosted the annual "Children's Spring Concert" on May 3, 2013 at the Laguna Hills Community Center. One hundred (100) patrons enjoyed games, food trucks and a concert in the park. Entertainment was provided by Jules Music for Kids. Table 1 below provides an event attendance comparison from 2011 through 2013.

A number of other programs were successful during the spring quarter. In the Excursion category, the Star Party at the Griffith Observatory Excursion was sold out with twenty (20) participants attending. Also well attended in the spring quarter were three sessions of "The Veggie Kitchen." "The Veggie Kitchen" offers participants easy and economical vegetarian recipes.

The Circle of Friends program continued to offer its monthly events, with the highlight of the spring season again being the Summer Kick-off Dance, previously the Spring Dance, which drew a crowd of sixty-eight participants. Table 2 provides an event attendance comparison for the Circle of Friends Summer Kick-Off Dance for the previous three years.
